Host Site Vs. Contract Site

**Definitions:**

Host Site - An organization that has agreed to provide the use of its facility to offer water related training to the water profession. Education offered at this facility is determined by the CA-NV AWWA Water College. Educational offerings are marketed to CA-NV AWWA members and water industry personnel.

Contract Site - An organization has entered into an agreement with the CA-NV AWWA Water College to offer educational offerings to their personnel or attendees solely. Education topic is selected by the contract site. The contract site pays the CA-NV AWWA Water College a flat fee for training services.

Host Site	Contract Site
Provides site and/or facility to be used for CA-NV AWWA Water College Training	
Host is provided 2 complimentary registrations for the training in which they are hosting	Registration fee per person is less
Open to outside attendance	Participants are at your discretion and invite list only
Training is determined by the CA-NV AWWA Water College	Training is provided based on your needs and requirements
CA-NV AWWA does all marketing to fill training offering	Class is filled with your personnel at your discretion
Training day/time is determined by CA-NV AWWA Water College (based on site availability)	Scheduled around your needs and/or requirements (ie: weekends, evenings, during business hours, etc.)
Convenient (Training in your place of business)	Convenient (Training in your place of business)
Cost effective (No overtime expenses or reimbursement of travel, since training takes place on-site)	Cost effective (No overtime expenses or reimbursement of travel, since training takes place on-site)
Training must make budget determined. If not training will be canceled	Training offered is secure with signed contract
